#### **Treehouse Wrap Around Care Provision**

Treehouse is available Monday to Friday, if you require wrap around care. Timings are as follows:

Before School - 7.30am - 8.45am After School - 3.15pm - 6.00pm

In order for us to ensure we adequately staff Treehouse, you must book a place for your child in advance. An online booking form will be sent out every Friday which needs to be completed and returned to us by 4pm on a Wednesday, detailing your childcare requirements for the following week.

If you book a place but no longer need it then please ensure that you cancel the space at least 24 hours in advance, otherwise you will be charged as staffing is based on the number of children in that day.

#### **Online Safety**

Controls are not a single solution to staying safe online; talking to your children and encouraging responsible behaviour is critical. However, controls are an important first step to helping to protect your child online. Here are seven simple things you can do to use them effectively:

- 1. Set up home broadband parental controls and make use of controls on your home broadband.
- 2. Set controls on your search engine; encourage your child to always use child-friendly search engines, and activate and lock the safe search settings on the browsers and platforms they use.
- 3. Make sure every device is protected. Controls should be installed on every device your child uses, such as their mobile phone, tablet and games consoles (both home and handheld).
- 4. Use privacy settings. Activate the safety measures offered by different sites; social networking sites like Facebook have privacy settings that will help prevent your child seeing unsuitable advertising or sharing too much with other people.
- 5. Block pop-ups. If you're worried about your children accessing inappropriate content through accidentally clicking on adverts in pop-ups, follow the advice from <u>Tech Advisor</u> on how to stop these.
- 6. Find good sites and agree on them as a family. By talking to your child about their interests you can help them find suitable sites to visit and apps to use. Review these sites as they get older.
- 7. Manage their use and access. Children may be very worried that your response to a problem will be to take away their internet access. Whilst this may be an appropriate response in some cases, the threat may be a barrier for a child who needs help. Be aware of this when talking to them about their internet use, and reassure them that they can talk to you or a trusted adult whenever they need to.

#### COVID-19 Update

As you know, it is now no longer necessary for pupils to isolate should they have been in contact with anybody who has tested positive for Covid. As such your child should continue to attend school unless NHS Test and Trace contact you. As at all other time - should your child develop any Covid symptoms then you should:

- Ensure that a PCR test is taken.
- Ensure your child self isolates until the result is given.
- Await a negative result. Then if your child no longer has symptoms they should return to school.
- Isolate as told by test and trace if the result is positive.

Should there be a positive case in your child's class then we will send a letter to remind you that your child should continue to attend.

Please could you continue to report any Positive PCR cases throughout half term so that we can continue to monitor the number of confirmed cases in school and take the appropriate action.
