#### Lincolnshire Day

Friday 1<sup>st</sup> October marks Lincolnshire Day, a whole 24 hours when people across the county can come together to celebrate everything good that this county has to offer. Lincolnshire Day is celebrated every year on 1<sup>st</sup> October and marks the anniversary of the Lincolnshire Rising, a revolt by Catholics against the establishment of the Church of England by Henry VIII in 1536. The first official Lincolnshire Day was held in 2006 to commemorate the uprising.

Lincolnshire has 50miles of coastline fun! Scampton, in Lincolnshire is the home to the Red Arrows, the famous RAF Aerobatic Team. In WW2 Lincolnshire was known as the Bomber County because it has more airfields for RAF planes than anywhere else in the UK. With so much produce homegrown and reared in Lincolnshire, there's no surprise the county is well known for its food and drink. We have lots of delicious delicacies unique to Lincolnshire— including Lincolnshire sausages, plum bread and poacher cheese.

Wow - the children have really impressed us with their learning and engagement in our celebrations of Lincolnshire Day. Linchfield has been flooded with proud 'Yellowbellies,' showing off their amazing artwork based on the things that make Lincolnshire special. We have had flags, castles, quarrelsome kings and gingerbread men galore. We even had a drawing of a Red Arrows flypast - all very exciting! #### Linchfield Learners

In Year 1, we have been learning all about place value in maths. The children have enjoyed taking part in practical maths activities, both indoors and outdoors.

During our class reading, we have been listening to, and discussing well known stories like, Aliens Love Underpants and Owl Babies.

In our science lessons, we have been learning about animals and animal groups. We took the opportunity to go outside for a mini-beast hunt to see what lives in our school environment.

As part of our geography work, we have been describing our families and the area that we live in. We have used some of this work to create a lovely class display.

Read Write Inc. Phonics is a structured programme which is designed to ensure all children learn to read accurately and fluently. We have adopted this scheme at Linchfield School and the Year 1 children are working really well in their phonics groups. They are making great progress in both reading and writing.
