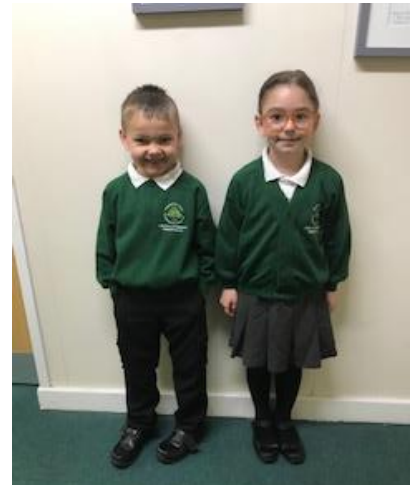

## Veg Power

To encourage children to be more aware and excited about vegetables and fruit, Farm Kitchen are running a 'Veg Power' curriculum-based project. 80% of children are not eating enough vegetables. Veg Power is on a mission to inspire children from early years through primary school and into their teens to develop veggie loving habits they will keep for life.

Some Year 6 children have offered to help run the project, alongside Mr Sedgwick. They will be conducting interviews and spending time in the school garden to help promote 'Veg Power'. During today's assembly, two Year 6 girls did a fantastic job of introducing the project to the rest of the school.

Children will have the opportunity to taste different vegetables each week in school and there are lots of different engaging activities for the children to join in with throughout the project.
